NCBAM'S 2014 NUMBERS



NCBAM marks fifth anniversary in 2014!

From a great idea five years ago, thousands of North Carolina Baptists are now serving the needs of the frail aging all across the State. Today, NCBAM's state-of-the-art Call Center fields more than **350** calls requesting help each month as **15,000** volunteers and service providers stand ready to be the hands and feet of Jesus in meeting those needs. Since 2009, NCBAM has connected more than **2,000** aging adults to volunteers who build wheelchair ramps, has mobilized **1,243** Baptist volunteers to install free smoke alarms, and has distributed more than **16,000** Red Bags. God is glorified through North Carolina Baptists as the frail aging receive loving care.

Since 2009, North Carolina Baptists have given **20,177** volunteer hours to help the State's aging. **12,212** volunteers have attended NCBAM trainings across North Carolina. And **319** people were impacted through evangelism & spiritual outreaches.



1 Leadership and Ministry Direction -

North Carolina Baptists insisted from the beginning that NCBAM be visionary and dynamic, and so Michael C. Blackwell was called to take the reigns. He chose Sandy Gregory as director and formed the initial team.



2 Call Center Services -

The NCBAM Call Center is the hub in serving the well- and frail-aging 65+. Hundreds of phone calls and emails traffic through NCBAM as Call Center Specialists partner with North Carolina Baptists to meet the many needs of its clients.



3 Servant Care Outreach -

North Carolina Baptists are determined to serve aging ministers 65+, their spouses and widows. Servant Care also provides fellowship and enrichment opportunities through its ENCORE events.



4 Priority #1: Prevention -

Safety and prevention are the keys to keeping aging adults living in their own homes as long as possible. NCBAM, in partnership with the Office of State Fire Marshal and other agencies, leads North Carolina Baptists in promoting



fire and fall safety, installing thousands of smoke alarms and grab bars, and advocating proper medication use.

5 Wheelchair Ramps

North Carolina Baptists build more wheelchair ramps than any other group in the State. NCBAM helps by connecting building teams to aging adults in need. In 2012 and 2014, *Rampin' Up!* was held and hundreds of ramps were built during the single-day events.
