North Carolina Baptist Aging Ministry – *Help for the Journey*

North Carolina Baptist Aging Ministry (NCBAM) is an award-winning ministry of Baptist Children's Homes of North Carolina (BCH-NC) that serves adults 65+ in North Carolina. NCBAM works closely with agencies in North Carolina's aging services network, with Baptist churches, other faith-based groups, and non-profits with the mission of helping seniors maintain independence in their own homes.

Qualifications

- Qualifying students will be from an accredited university or seminary seeking a degree in ministry, gerontology, geriatric counseling, geriatric nursing, human development/family studies, social work, communications, or another related field.
- The ideal candidate will be nearing the end of their undergraduate or graduate studies with a minimum program GPA of 2.8 (4.0 scale).
- Interns agree to conduct themselves in a manner consistent with Christian principles and BCH organizational philosophy, including performing work in a careful manner with highest regard for the safety of themselves and others present, as well as all other BCH stakeholders.
- Interns will pass a volunteer/non-employee background check.

Benefits

- NCBAM offers unique and varied learning experiences. Our Call Center provides I&R services. Our Care Village in Kinston provides geriatric management services. Our regional directors connect with aging adults and organizations across the state – presenting workshops, recruiting volunteers, staging events, completing needs assessments and plans of care.
- An individualized job description will be written addressing the intern's educational goals and interests.
- Internships are unpaid (unless otherwise agreed upon), but interns will be reimbursed for business expenses such as travel outside the NCBAM office.
- The intern will learn about NCBAM's parent organization and the job opportunities within both NCBAM and BCH-NC.
- NCBAM follows guidelines established by the U.S. Department of Labor regarding internship programs under the Fair Labor Standards Act.
- NCBAM adheres to the vision statement established by BCH-NC which is "to provide the highest quality of Christian services to children, adults, and families in a caring culture of measurable excellence."
